Hulland Ward Parish Council News Village Hall Car Park Extension

Due to delays in funding, Planning Application 20/00765/FUL has lapsed and a new Application has had to be submitted. For a number of reasons, construction costs in the intervening 3 years have doubled, creating real problems in finding the additional funding to finance the project.

<u>MVAS and</u> <u>Average Speed Cameras</u>

As most Villagers know, the 2 MVAS cameras (Mobile Activated Vehicle Signs) collect and record vehicle speed data along the Main Road.

During 2023 the number of vehicles 'clocked' by the MVAS systems was just over 1,817,000 cars, vans and lorries. Of these, the number exceeding 35mph (the speed above which police prosecute speeding drivers) is 135,991 vehicles. Had these speeding drivers been caught by the police and fined the statutory £100, then the Derbyshire Constabulary would have raised nearly £13,600,000.

The Parish Council is aware that the fitting of an Average Speed Camera system through our Village would eliminate the problem 'over night' and we are pursuing this request through County and the Derbyshire Constabulary.

It is wrong that 135,991 drivers are allowed to disregard the Law through our Village every year, when there is an effective remedy available.

Hand-Held Speed Cameras

2 Teams have now been established to undertake speed checks with Hand Held Cameras at each end



of the Village.

The ongoing target of 2 speed checks a month, together with the official Police Speed checks, is gradually producing a deterrent for speeding drivers.

21/00644/FUL Land at Eaton Farmhouse, HW

This small development of 3 mixed properties is now nearing completion, with just the entrance road to be finished and the verge along the Main Road to be repaired. All work should by completed by end March 2024.

23/00435/FUL Land off Biggin View, Biggin

This application, for a further 16 houses, following rejection by both Parish Council and District Council, has been **allowed under appeal**, which means this development can legally progress. The Parish Council understand groundwork could commence late Spring - with all construction traffic using the temporary access adjacent to the Dog Lane /Main Road junction.

19/00159/REM Wheeldon Way, Biggin was approved by Derbyshire Dales Planning Committee on 10th September 2020. Groundwork is now well advanced for the 39 mixed properties with a number already sold (off plan) according to the website: **www.guildhomes.co.uk.** Progress will continue to be monitored by the local Residents Committee and the Parish Council until the new site is completed.

Your Local Councillor's update

Hulland Village: Tim Sadler writes about developments elsewhere in this Herald edition. All round, I'm happy we have secured these road safety improvements.

Intake Lane Crossroads: A major road safety improvement for this has taken far too long to start. To be fair there were some valid reasons for delays but these are wearing a little thin now. I have been told all the money is now in place and am assured the work will start very soon.

Wheeldon Way: I have visited residents close to the development. The cones on the site access have helped stop inappropriate parking. However, issues go beyond this entrance - damage to the highway, kerbs and verges – now reported to DCC Highways. I'm not sure how this will be dealt with but I will let you know once I receive a response.

The Knockerdown Inn: The Planning Application to increase parking was only a ruse, in my opinion, to facilitate a larger car enthusiasts' weekend venue. Such a site by the busy B5035 is not the right location especially with the road's poor accident profile. At the planning meeting a gentleman living near a similar venue run by the same company in Warwickshire shared his and others experiences at weekends. Apparently, it's an appalling experience with long convoys of cars racing the country lanes and other anti-social behaviours. I thank everyone who supported the successful campaign to reject the Application.

Angelique Foster, Police & Crime Commission: Angelique visited Hulland Ward to discuss speeding issues experienced despite very effective speed signs each end of the Village. The monthly statistics I receive from Karl Dean make sobering reading. Too many drivers show little regard for the limits. We need cameras that take offenders' details which could then lead to fines and points. It is not going be easy to progress this but we will not give up. Angelique offered advice and support on what we are trying to do. Thanks to Karl and the other volunteers who work to raise awareness of the speeding issues. In the next month or so we hope to raise a survey/petition on road safety issues in the Village and use this to push the local authorities to support our wishes for better enforcement of speed limits.

Pot Holes: I don't know what you call multiple pot holes, a plague might be a good description! I see pot holes where I haven't seen them before. Heavy rainfall in recent months has caused far more than experienced for many years. Can you please report potholes on the DCC website? I do this when I see them but I don't see them all. I do know teams are out in Derbyshire making repairs. Extra money is being spent on the problem but it will take time before we top the backlog. I plan to walk the whole area over the coming weeks to record all the issues but don't let me put you off making a report to DCC. The quicker potholes are reported the sooner they are repaired. I thank you for your patience.

After at least 40 years pressurising Derbyshire County Council's Highway Department we now have good news. Large multiple signs have been installed on Hulland Hill in both directions above and below the area which includes the Bus Stop and the turn into Hulland Village. These signs are designed to slow the traffic down considerably to make the area safer for all users. However, there are still three actions required to complete the safety work. First, large 'SLOW' signs will be painted on the road in the appropriate place above and below the road junction. Secondly, there is still a need for an Advanced Junction Sign next to the New Hulland Village sign 130 metres above the Junction. These have been promised sooner or later. When? We will see. Meanwhile, once the job is complete we will determine whether the new arrangements have done enough to make the area as safe as we can reasonably expect.
